We are all super excited to begin a new school year with lots of fun and exciting activities planned This year Kingfishers will be taught by Mrs Steggles on a Monday and Tuesday, and by Mr Robson Wednesday to Friday. English: This term we will write a variety of text types including a narrative, non-chronological report and poetry.

Guided Reading: Our first novel of the year will be The Hodgeheg by Dick King-Smith and then will progressing on to be 'The Nothing to see here Hotel' by Steven Butler.

Maths: In our maths we will begin by exploring place value before moving onto addition and subtraction. Another area of key focus will be times tables to support them with the year 4 times table check.

PE: These lessons will take place on a **Monday** with Mrs Steggles and **Friday** with Mr Robson. We will be exploring ball skills and Tag rugby.

History: After half term, we will be exploring Ancient Civilizations and what each of these civilizations have. We will explore language, writing, art and culture.

Geography: This half term we will be exploring physical Geography and how the Earth works. We will then begin to explore volcanoes and earthquakes.

Science: In science we will be learning all about human biology.

RE: In RE we are studying Christianity, and the question: How do Christians show that 'reconciliation' with God and other people is important?

PSHE: In PSHE we are learning about 'Being Me' and how each person is individual.

Computing: In computing, we are exploring tough typing.

Art: In art, the children will be exploring sketching techniques.

French: This half term we are exploring French phonics.
